## The Seal of the Presbyterian Church (USA)

...is a symbolic statement  
of the church's heritage,  
identity, and mission.

It is also meant to be  
a statement of the theological  
affirmations of the PC-USA.

The dominant structural  
and theological element is  
the cross, with the Bible—  
proclaimed by Martin Luther  
and John Calvin to be the  
“authority for Christian life”  
lying open to form the  
horizontal bar.

Forming the top of the cross  
is the dove descending.

An image of a fish can be dis-  
cerned as the body of the  
dove. Other symbols in the  
cross include four flames at  
its base, and the cup or font  
forming the central pillar.

Malcolm Grear, an eminent  
graphic designer, was  
selected in 1984 to design the  
Seal. Four thousand drawings  
later, Grear's final revision  
was presented to the General  
Assembly and formally  
adopted in 1985.

The Seal is prominently  
incorporated into the cover  
design of our current  
(1990) Blue Hymnal.
