

The Corporate Prayer of Confession

You know the story of how we landed in the dilemma we're in—first sin, then death, and no one exempt from either sin or death. Sin disturbed relations with God in everything and everyone.

Lord, we confess we feel surrounded by troubles in our lives and our world.

Yet we continue to shout our praise even when we're hemmed in with troubles, because we know how troubles can develop passionate patience in us, and how that patience in turn forges the tempered steel of virtue, keeping us alert for whatever God will do next.

Lord, we confess we are weak and feel ill-equipped for relationship with you.

Christ arrives right on time to make this happen. He didn't, and doesn't, wait for us to get ready. He presented himself by this sacrificial death when we were far too weak and rebellious to do anything to get ourselves ready.

Lord, we confess we often fail to embrace your gift of love.

By entering through faith into what God has always wanted to do for us—set us right with him, make us fit for him—we have it all together with God because of our Master Jesus. Sin didn't, and doesn't, have a chance in competition with the aggressive forgiveness we call grace. When it's sin versus grace, grace wins hands down.

We throw open our doors to God and discover at the same moment that he has already thrown open his door to us.

We find ourselves standing where we always hoped we might stand—out in the wide-open spaces of God's grace and glory, standing tall and shouting our praise.


*Our Father, who is in
