What is Ordinary Time?

Most of the church year is organized around the two major festivals that mark sacred time
Christmas and Easter.

The rest of the year is known as **Ordinary Time**. This term comes from the word "ordinal," which means "counted time." Ordinary Time begins with Trinity Sunday and ends with Christ the King Sunday.

The liturgical color for Ordinary Time is dark green, although other shades of green are commonly used. Green has traditionally been associated with new growth and life. The Sundays of Ordinary Time are often used to focus on various aspects of faith, especially the mission of the church in the world.



DRC Background (Part 3, cont'd)

The forced displacement of residents in the DRC has many ripple effects. While the land supports food production, many villages are destroyed. Food shortages and the risk of malnutrition or starvation is a serious issue. There is also a lack of sanitation and clean water sources, leaving the people at risk for serious water-borne illness. Children are at greatest risk as they are not able to handle the dehydration that comes with these illnesses. Sexual violence among displaced people occurs with increasing frequency, which contributes to serious mental health issues. It is easy to understand why families seek to leave these conditions in the DRC.
